

### Headteacher's message

Dear Parents and Carers,

The first week back has flown by and we have only six weeks left of the academic year. There is still plenty to squeeze in, but as a team, we have started to look forward to next year and consider our plans.

There are lots of discussions going on as to what our classes will look like, and as we did last year, we will be sending out letters at the end of the month, before transition, so that you can share the news with your child as to who their new teacher will be.

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

Good Afternoon,



Thank you for being such fantastic partners in your child's education!






