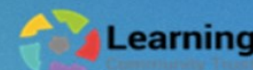

Applying for primary school places

Parents and carers of children who are due to start primary or secondary school next September can now apply for their school place.

Children born between September 2021 and August 2022 will be due to start primary school in September next year (2026). To ensure those children are allocated a school place, parents and carers must have applied to Telford & Wrekin Council by 15 January 2026.

Children born between September 2014 and August 2015 are due to start secondary school next year and parents and carers have until 31 October 2025 to apply for their school place.

Parent & Carer Alert: The "Salt & Ice Challenge"

A dangerous online trend is resurfacing where children put salt on their skin and press ice on top.

☞ This causes serious cold burns (like frostbite).

☞ Injuries can need hospital treatment and even skin grafts.

☞ Young people may not realise the damage until it's too late.

☑ First Aid: Cool with lukewarm running water for 10+ minutes, cover with clean cling film, and seek medical help.

✗ Do NOT use ice, creams, or fluffy dressings.
