Why every day at school counts - especially in Year 6


Did you know that children who attend school regularly in Year 6 are much more likely to do well in their SATs? A recent report shows that pupils with 95 -100% attendance are far more likely to reach the expected levels in reading, writing, and maths.

Even missing just 10 days in the school year can make a big difference. Children with lower attendance—around 90% or less—are much less likely to meet national expectations. And for those who miss a lot of school, the chances of doing well drop even further.

This shows how important it is for children to be in school every day, especially in an assessment year like Year 6. Every lesson builds on the last, and missing time can make it harder for children to keep up and feel confident.

We know that sometimes absences are unavoidable, but working together to support good attendance can make a real difference to your child's learning and future opportunities.

Applying for primary school places

Parents and carers of children who are due to start primary or secondary school next September can now apply for their school place.

Children born between September 2021 and August 2022 will be due to start primary school in September next year (2026). To ensure those children are allocated a school place, parents and carers must have applied to Telford & Wrekin Council by January 2026.

Children born between September 2014 and August 2015 are due to start secondary school next year and parents and carers have until 31 October 2025 to apply for their school place.

Secondary school admissions

To apply for a secondary school place you will need to complete and submit an online application form using the link below.

To apply for a place at **Thomas Telford School**, you will need to apply to the school directly by 22 September 2025. You should not list this school on your online application.

Applicants to **Madeley Academy** will be invited to attend a non-verbal reasoning assessment in November 2025. If you are applying to **Holy Trinity Academy** or any other faith schools you may also need to complete a 'supplementary information form'.

These will be available on the school's website and should be returned to the school (s) directly as well as listing the school (s) on your online application form. Parents who apply before the closing date will receive an email with the outcome of their application on **Secondary National Offer Day - 2 March 2026**.

Headlice

Head lice are a common issue in primary schools, and they can spread quickly among children, particularly when they are in close contact during playtime or group activities. They cannot jump, fly or swim. Itching and scratching occurs 2 to 3 weeks after coming into close contact with someone who has headlice. While head lice do not pose a serious health threat, they can be a nuisance and cause discomfort for your child.

Regular checks of your child's hair are essential for early detection and prevention of head lice infestations. Please take a few minutes to thoroughly inspect your child's hair for any signs of lice, such as:

- Itching or scratching of the scalp
- Visible lice or eggs (nits) attached to the hair
- Red bumps or sores on the scalp

If you discover that your child has head lice, it's essential to take prompt action to treat the infestation and prevent it from spreading to other children.

- •Head lice are common among young children and their families
- •Head lice don't spread disease
- •Head lice can be spread from adults to children and back again
- •There's nothing to be embarrassed or ashamed about having head lice
- •Having head lice has nothing to do with good or bad personal hygiene
- •Lice eggs hatch after around 7 days so two applications are always needed to make sure all lice have been killed.
