Is my child too ill for school? - NHS guidance for parents

As we head into the colder months, many parents face the daily dilemma: is my child too ill to attend school? The NHS has published a helpful guide to support families in making informed decisions about school attendance when children are unwell. The document outlines clear advice on common childhood illnesses such as coughs, colds, conjunctivitis, chickenpox, and even COVID-19. It explains when children should stay home and when they're safe to attend school, helping reduce unnecessary absences while keeping everyone safe.

For example, children with mild cold symptoms like a runny nose or sore throat can usually go to school, but those with a high temp should stay home until it subsides. The guidance also offers advice on managing anxiety-related symptoms and how schools can support children's wellbeing.

This resource is especially useful for parents, carers, and school staff working together to maintain healthy attendance and minimise the spread of illness. You can read the full NHS guidance here:



A child may need major surgery to remove them. So, keep them away from young children. And teach older children the risks.




If you suspect a child has swallowed magnets, get medical help straight away.

The internet service provider, Nominet has confirmed that it has now suspended the site for breaching the Online Safety Act.
