



### ATTENDANCE UPDATE

**Good Afternoon** 

Walking to school in autumn and winter can be a safe, healthy, and positive experience for children when the right precautions are taken. With darker mornings and earlier evenings, visibility becomes crucial—bright or reflective clothing, accessories, and school bags help children stand out to drivers. Reinforcing road safety rules, such as using pedestrian crossings and avoiding distractions like phones, is essential. Younger children should walk with an adult or in a group whenever possible. Slippery paths caused by wet leaves, ice, or snow mean children need sturdy footwear with good grip. Leaving home with enough time to walk carefully helps prevent accidents and reduces stress. Knowing their route and having a plan if something goes wrong—like how to contact a trusted adult—adds an extra layer of safety.

Importantly, walking to school can also improve attendance. Children who walk regularly are less likely to be late due to traffic delays or missed buses. It encourages routine, independence, and a sense of responsibility. For some families, walking can remove barriers to getting to school, especially when transport is unreliable. Promoting safe walking habits not only protects children but also supports their learning by helping them arrive on time, ready to start the day.

### Help your child with additional funding through Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is extra funding for our school to support children who:

- Qualify for Free School Meals (FSM).
- \* Are in care or have been adopted,
  - Have a parent in the armed forces.

This funding helps us provide extra learning support, wellbeing resources, and enrichment opportunities.

Even if your child doesn't want a free meal, applying helps the school access more support for all pupils.




If your child is in Reception, Year 1, or Year 2, they already get free meals but you still need to apply to unlock Pupil Premium funding.

You may qualify if you receive:

- Universal Credit (income under £7,400/year),
  - Income Support or Jobseeker's Allowance,
  - Child Tax Credit (without Working Tax Credit, income under £16.190).
  - Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit).
  - · Support under the Immigration and Asylum Act.
