

Good afternoon,

These daily wins—answering a question, finishing a task, joining in a group activity—gradually build self-belief and a sense of achievement. Over time, this strengthens their ability to face challenges, bounce back from setbacks, and keep going when things get tough. Resilience isn't something children are born with—it's something they grow through experience. And regular attendance gives them those experiences. It helps them learn that effort leads to progress, and that they are capable of overcoming obstacles.

As parents and carers, you play a key role in this journey. Encouraging your child to attend school every day, even when it feels hard, sends a powerful message: you believe in them and their future. Quorra, in Year 6, has said, "Our attendance help us with many things in life. In school we can socialise with others and when I go to school, I am with my friends."
