ATTENDANCE UPDATE

Good afternoon,

Regular school attendance is about more than just learning—it's about feeling connected. When children attend school consistently, they build strong relationships with peers and staff, creating a sense of belonging that is vital for mental wellbeing. Being part of a community helps children feel valued and supported, reducing feelings of isolation and anxiety.

School provides structure and routine, which are key to emotional stability. Predictable days give children a sense of security, helping them manage stress and develop resilience. Missing school can disrupt this routine, making it harder for children to stay engaged and confident.

Attendance also opens doors to opportunities for social interaction, teamwork, and problem-solving—skills that boost self-esteem and emotional health. When children feel connected, they are more likely to thrive academically and personally.

Top tips:

- Establish a consistent bedtime and morning routine.
 - Talk positively about school and its benefits.
 - Plan appointments outside school hours where possible.
 - If your child feels anxious, speak to school staff early for support.
 - Celebrate good attendance to reinforce its importance.
- Together, we can make attendance a priority—not just for learning, but for happiness and mental health.

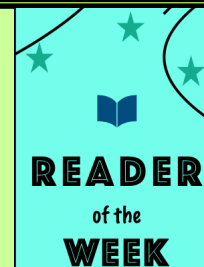


The teachers choose a pupil who they feel has done something special in the week for this award. This could be academic or for behaviour and conduct linked to our values of happy, successful, curious communicators.
