Week 1-To identify the key events in Ancient Greek history and plot them on a timeline

 $\textbf{Lesson 1} \hbox{: To be able to identify common appliances that run on electricity}.$

Lesson 3: To be able to identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit, based on whether or not the lamp is part of a complete loop with a battery.

Lesson 5: Recognise some common conductors and insulators, and associate metals with being good conductors.
